From the Pastor's Pen General Conference Report

Every four years the United Methodist Church has up to 1000 laity and clergy delegates elected from every annual conference in the world meet to update our *Book of Discipline* and the *Book of Resolutions*. This year they met April 24-May 4 in Tampa, Florida.

Here are some of the highlights addressed this year:

- Passed a proposal to restructure at the highest level of the church but it was ruled unconstitutional by the Judicial Council;
- Celebrated an Act of Repentance toward indigenous people pertaining to actions over a century ago;

Retained the church's position regarding homosexuality, deciding not to adopt language that would have said United Methodists are not of one mind on this issue;

Did away with "guaranteed appointments" for clergy;

Rejected a proposal for setting aside a bishop to serve as full-time president of the Council of Bishops;

Entered into full communion with a number of historically black pan-Methodist denominations;

Approved making the United Methodist Women an autonomous organization rather than operating it under the church's missions agency;

Finance Update | FUMC

Over the years I have found the end of April, the end of August, and the end of December as extremely good points to measure a church's annual financial health. So having had some time to digest the numbers through April, it seemed a good time to give you my perspective.

The following projections are based on our history of giving in order to give us a realistic target by which to measure.

	2012 Goal thru April	2012 Actual thru April	Difference

For those of us who are not as visual with numbers, let me interpret these numbers. Our projection was that according to our normal patterns of giving we would be in a deficit of \$5,763.68 by the end of April but the actual deficit was only \$3,115.53. This is good news except that our total giving was \$2447.97 below our projection. The only reason we are in as good of shape as we are is that we have kept our expenses well below our budget. However, there is no guarantee we can do this throughout the year.

The main budget areas that are over budget for this point in the year relate to our children's and youth budgets, but these are growth areas for the church, so if we could pick areas to be over budget, these are the ones I'd want to pick. The good news is that May giving has been good and is within reach of our target for the month with one Sunday to go. Thanks for your faithfulness in giving! Please, do all you can to be consistent so that we can maintain our ministry plans throughout the coming months.

Created a national ministry plan for Pacific Islanders; Adopted a \$603.1 million budget for the 2013-2016 period; and

Decided not to divest from three companies whose products are used by the Israeli military in the occupied Palestinian territories.

The delegates, from more than 60 nations, processed some 1,200 petitions during the assembly. General Conference meets every four years and is the only body that speaks for the 13 millionmember denomination.

The Book of Discipline contains our church's constitution, Articles of Religion (faith statement), Social Policy, and polity for how we are structured at every level of the church.
